Living Lands & Waters Calls For Volunteers

Since 1998 Living Lands & Waters (LL&W), has worked with over 97,000 volunteers to remove 8.7 MILLION pounds of marine debris from America's Rivers and they need YOUR help on the Ohio River this fall! LL&W operates on a one-of-a-kind fleet of barges, known as the only "industrial strength" river cleanup operation like it in the world. The eighth stop on their 2016 Ohio River Tour will be in Westport, KY.

They will be hosting several river cleanups, as well as free educational workshops for local high schools aboard their floating classroom. These workshops seek to inspire a new appreciation for our nation's rivers through activities like: Biological Magnification, Macroinvertebrate Identification, Mississippi River Watershed, and more!

There will typically be 2 river cleanups a day: 9am-12pm and 1pm-4pm. Individuals, families, and groups are welcome; however, we recommend volunteers be 12 years or older. Each time slot can accommodate up to 45 volunteers per day! We provide all necessary materials including: lunch, trash bags, gloves, life jackets, water, sunscreen, and bug spray.
